

Supplies for Acrylic Painting

- **Acrylic colors:** Alizarin Crimson, Cad. Red Medium, Cad. Yellow Medium, Ultramarine Blue, Hooker's Green, Burnt Umber, Burnt Sienna, Raw Umber, Raw Sienna, Cadmium Orange, Diox. Purple, Quin. Magenta, Payne's Gray. Colors come in 2 Oz. tubes. Titanium White (4.65 Fl. Oz.) Please do not buy Black! (If you buy the large tubes of color, like *Basics*, it's much cheaper.)
- **Supports:** Canvas board, stretched canvas, or birch painting panels. Good sizes are 12 x 18, 12 x 12, 18 x 24. If you're really feeling gutsy, try a 24 x 36. Come prepared to work on at least 2 supports, so you'll always have a dry surface all the time.
- **Drawing Tools:** #2 or HB pencil, vine charcoal (not compressed charcoal)
- **Palette knife:** If you would like to try this, buy one that has a shape like a small trowel.
- **Rags:** Package of terrycloth rags. (You can get these from a hardware store.)
- **Sketching pad:** Something about 9 x 12. Or use computer paper
- **Brushes:** Buy stiff brushes (hog's hair). Sizes #2,5,8, and 12 are good sizes. Brushes come in flat, round, and filbert shapes. Buy flats or filberts. (Don't buy brushes in a set. They won't last).
- **Palette:** You can use a white plastic or pottery plate. Or a peelable palette. If you want a palette with a cover that will keep the paint wet, I suggest a Masterson palette. 12 x 16" which is airtight.

Please don't be intimidated by this list. We'll talk about the use of the supplies on the first lesson. When you go to an art supply store, share your list with the sales person. Words like "Alizaron Crimson" will become less intimidating!
