

ART 132 DRAWING II

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: ENG 090, RED 090, or satisfactory score on placement test, and ART 131

Corequisites: None

This course continues instruction in the language of drawing and the use of various materials. Emphasis is on experimentation in the use of drawing techniques, media, and graphic materials. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate increased competence in the expressive use of graphic form and techniques. *This course has been approved to satisfy the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement for transferability as a premajor and/or elective course requirement.* Course Hours Per Week: Lab, 6. Semester Hours Credit, 3.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

- I. Students will be able to demonstrate the advanced use of artistic tool, materials and concepts in the creation of visual media by:
 - a. demonstrating new approaches to drawing;
 - b. describing the process of drawing as a fundamental and important artistic activity; and;
 - c. inventing and experimenting with drawing tools and media.

- II. Students will be able to critically evaluate their work and respond to the critical analysis of their work by others by:
 - a. developing personal artistic styles and;
 - b. demonstrating artistic growth and experimentation.

- I. Realizing different approaches to same problem
- J. Analyzing, understanding success/failure of your own work
- K. Analyzing the work of others

- L. Making changes, additions to work
- M. Selecting work for a portfolio
- N. Matting and framing
- O. Mounting an exhibition
