

**ENG 095A**  
**READING AND COMPOSITION STRATEGIES LAB**

**COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Prerequisites: ENG 080 and RED 080, or satisfactory score on placement test

Corequisites: ENG 095

This laboratory provides the opportunity to practice the skills introduced in ENG 095. Emphasis is on applying critical reading skills to narrative and expository texts and on the writing process. Upon completion, students should be able to apply those skills in producing effective essays as preparation for college writing. Course Hours Per Week: Lab, 2. Semester Hours Credit, 1.

**LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

At the completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- a. Compose well-developed, coherent paragraphs and essays in standard written English
- b. Apply knowledge of standard written English to edit texts.
- c. Locate, analyze, and evaluate appropriate research materials.
- d. Develop, communicate, and defend analysis of texts.
- e. Incorporate research into academic writing using MLA guidelines.
- f. Prepare and deliver oral presentation.
- g. Use word processing software to draft and edit work.
