EMERGENCY OPERATIONS CENTER MANAGEMENT

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisite: FIP 236

Corequisite: None

This course provides students with the knowledge and skills to effectively manage and operate an EOC during crisis situations. Topics include properly locating and designing an EOC, staffing, training and briefing EOC personnel, and how to operate an EOC. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate how to set up and operate an effective emergency operations center. Course Hours Per Week: Class, 3. Lab, 0. Semester Hours Credit, 3.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

Upon successful completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- a. Determine the best location for the emergency operation center.
- b. Have a basic knowledge of the technology needed to operate an emergency operation center.
- c. Determine the physical design of the emergency operation center.
- d. Understand the functional and space layouts of an emergency operation center.
- e. Understand the financing an emergency operation center.
- f. Discuss the organization of an emergency operation center.
- g. Determine the staffing requirements of an emergency operation center.
- h. Understand and resolve conflict that will arise in an emergency operation center.
- i. Understand the stress associated with emergency operations.
- j. Analyze and understand the decision making and problem solving issues associated in an emergency operation center.
- k. Use standard operating procedures in simulated emergency operation center activations.
- l. Analyze and evaluate standard operating procedures.
- m. Conduct briefings in an emergency operation center.
- n. Describe the importance of conducting exercises and evaluations of the emergency operation center.
