**Additional Breadth (3 credit hours):** Additional Breadth courses must be chosen in a field distinct from the major. So science, technology, engineering, and math majors would choose an additional breadth class from the Humanities/Social Sciences/Visual and Performing Arts categories listed above or from the following courses: ART 114, 115, 116; COM 231; HUM 160 ; MUS 110, 112. Students majoring in the humanities and social sciences would choose an additional breadth class from the Math and Science categories.

<sup>1</sup> Students who complete the AA, AS, or AE degrees are considered to have met the GEPs at NCSU, with the exception of health and physical education and foreign language proficiency. Students who transfer before completing the degree will have to complete all GEPs.
