EMS 231 EMS Clinical Practicum III

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: Take: EMS 221

Corequisites: None

This course provides clinical experiences in the hospital and/or field. Emphasis is placed on enhancing the students' skills and abilities in providing advanced-level care. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate continued progress in advanced-level patient care.

Course Hours per Week: Class, 0. Clinical Hours per week, 9. Semester Hours Credit, 3.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon completing requirements for this course, the student will be able to:

- Competently perform paramedic-level skills on live patients in a hospital or pre-hospital setting in accordance with syllabus (to include EKG interpretation, airway management, and medication administration).
- 2. Interact with patients and other healthcare providers in a professional and appropriate manner.
- 3. Use therapeutic communication strategies in interactions with patients.
- 4. Perform full patient physical assessment and history-taking accurately document patient encounters.
- 5. Identify signs and systems of medical and traumatic emergencies in prehospital patients.
- 6. Develop field impressions of medical and trauma patients with various chief complaints.
- 7. Develop differential diagnosis for medical and traumatic chief complaints.
- 8. Formulate a prehospital treatment plan for medical and trauma patients.

OUTLINE OF INSTRUCTION:

- I. Completion of Practicum II
- II. Expand Students Clinical and Field Rotations
 - A. Students to become more autonomous while still operating under the preceptor
 - B. Additional specialty care rotations (OB, BURN ICU, ER Physician rotation)
 - C. Utilize entire scope of practice of the paramedic with supervision
 - a. Assess, and form treatment plan according to state and local protocols
 - D. Continue to ensure SMC (student minimum competency) is being completed
- III. Successfully complete the min required hours
 - A. 150 hours (about 12 and a half days)
- IV. Complete Progress meeting with clinical coordinator
