ENG 011 – Writing and Inquiry Support

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: ENG 002 Corequisites: ENG 111

Course description. This course is designed to support students in the development of skills necessary for success in ENG 111 by complementing, supporting, and reinforcing ENG 111 Student Learning Outcomes. Emphasis is placed on developing a growth mindset, expanding skills for use in active reading and writing processes, recognizing organizational relationships within texts from a variety of genres and formats, and employing appropriate technology when reading and composing texts. Upon completion, students should be able to apply active reading strategies to college-level texts and produce unified, well-developed writing using standard written English.

Course Hours Per Week: 3, Semester Hours Credit: 2.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Upon completing requirements for this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Practice pre-reading, reading, and post-reading strategies with course texts to aid comprehension.
- 2. Examine how passage elements such as author's purpose, author's use of logical reasoning, author's intended audience, author's use of tone, author's use of emotional appeals, and author's credibility contributed to the overall argument.
- 3. Practice "writing as a conversation" through original written texts.
- 4. Demonstrate research strategies for choosing a topic, finding appropriate sources, and evaluating sources.
- 5. Utilize the Writing Process when composing original texts.
- 6. Compose original texts with a focused main idea or thesis and developed, coherent support.
- 7. Illustrate MLA standards that include a heading, page numbering, indented paragraphs, and doublespacing when composing original texts.
- 8. Employ Standard Written English rules when composing texts.
- 9. Make ethical use of technology when composing texts.
