

NAS 102 Nurse Aide II

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: ONE of the following: HS diploma/Equivalency, OR successful completion of ENG002 OR EFL073, OR unofficial college transcript showing successful completion of college level English (ENG 111 or higher). Listing on the NA -I registry with no substantiated negative findings.

Corequisites: None

This course is designed to prepare individuals to provide more complex and invasive patient care skills for hospitalized clients. Emphasis is placed on the role of the NAII, Sterile Technique demonstrated by urinary catheterization, wound care, respiratory procedures, and tracheostomy care. Other skills include ostomy care, assisting with alternative feeding methods, monitoring and discontinuing Peripheral Intravenous fluids. *Upon completion the student should be able to demonstrate knowledge and skill necessary to be eligible for listing on the North Carolina Nurse Aide II Registry.*

The Nurse Aide II Training Course consists of classroom, laboratory, and clinical components. The student must successfully complete all components in order to be eligible to apply for listing on the North Carolina Board of Nursing Nurse Aide II Registry.

Course Hours per Week: Class, 3. Lab 4 Clinical 3 Semester Hours Credit 6.

Upon completing requirements for this course, the student will be able to:

1. To understand the role of the NA II as an individual and how the NAII functions within the healthcare team.
2. Perform complex patient care skills for clients as defined by the NCBON.
3. To provide safe personal care to all clients.
4. Competently and effectively perform Nurse Aide II Skills as outlined in NCBON Nurse Aide II tasks.

- VI. Elimination Procedures-Performing ostomy care procedures.
- VII. Oxygen Therapy-Care of patient receiving oxygen therapy.
- VIII. Suctioning- Performing suction procedures.
- IX. Tracheostomy Care-Performing Tracheostomy care procedures
- X. Monitoring and discontinuing Peripheral IV Fluids

Additional Clinical Requirements:

1. A copy of completed Hepatitis B vaccination series.
2. A copy of negative TB skin/blood test results valid through the end of the course:
 - a. A 2-step test (given 3 weeks a part) *OR*
 - b. A QuantiFERON Gold Blood Test (Lab report required) *OR*
 - c. A negative chest x-ray within the past 5 years if you have a history of a positive PPD (TB test).
3. A copy of Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis vaccination (TDAP- 1 dose and then a booster every 10 years)
4. A copy of 2 doses of Measles, Mumps, and Rubella (MMR) immunization or positive Titer (History of Disease is not accepted)
5. A copy of Varicella immunization (History of Disease is not accepted)
6. Proof of full Covid immunization
7. Annual Influenza vaccine (current)
8. American Heart Association Basic Life Support (BLS) certification
9. Criminal Background check and Drug screen
