SPA 231 Reading and Composition

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Prerequisites: DRE 097 or ENG-002 and SPA 212 with minimum grade of C; or satisfactory score on

placement test

Corequisites: None

This course provides an opportunity for intensive reading and composition in Spanish. Emphasis is on the use of literary and cultural materials to enhance and expand reading and writing skills. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate in writing an in-depth understanding of assigned readings. This course has been approved to satisfy the Comprehensive Articulation Agreement for transferability as a premajor and/or elective course requirement.

Course Hours Per Week: Class, 3. Semester Hours Credit, 3.

 - D. Identify and demonstrate use of various reading strategies

 - A. Narrate stories based on experiences in academic, social, and professional topics of interest
 - B. Present an argument with supporting evidence
 - C. Prepare detailed presentations demonstrating an awareness of perspective, tone and audience
 - D. Identify and demonstrate use of writing strategies including a writing process
 - E. Use proper citation for quotations and research sources
