# **SPI 213 Review of Grammar**

### **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

Prerequisites: DRE 097, ENG 002, or EFL 074 and EFL 094; or satisfactory score on English placement test; and

SPA 212 or satisfactory score on Spanish placement test; or, permission of program director

Corequisites: None

This course is designed to review the common elements of Spanish grammar in oral and written form. Emphasis is on the fundamental grammatical concepts of the Spanish language. Upon completion, students should be able to demonstrate comprehension and correct usage of specified grammatical concepts in both oral and written form.

Course Hours per Week: Class, 3. Semester Hours Credit, 3.

Upon completing requirements for this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify correct grammatical structures when translating into and out of English and Spanish.
- 2. Demonstrate advanced proficiency in the Spanish language by using complex constructions.
- 3. Describe structural grammatical differences in Spanish and English and their nuanced subtleties.
