# Elementary Education Residency Licensure Certificate Handbook

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#### **Enrollment Overview**

All steps in the enrollment process must be completed before permission to register for courses is granted.

- 1. Step 1 Apply to Durham Tech
  - a. Create/Log into your <a href="CFNC account">CFNC account</a>;
  - b. Once logged in, follow these steps to find the correct application:
     Apply to College -> Application Hub -> Start an Application -> Select Durham
     Tech then Elementary Education Residency Licensure Certificate in the
     Enrollment Information section of the application.
  - c. Complete and submit application.
- 2. Submit official transcripts that show you have completed a bachelor's degree with at least 24 hours of coursework in the licensure area (general education credits) and met the 2.7 GPA requirement.

There are two options for submitting transcripts:

Request electronic transcripts through an approved transcript service such as ACT, CFNC, College Board, Joint Services Transcripts, National Student Clearinghouse, Parchment, ScribOnline and Script-Safe. List transcripts@durhamtech.edu as the recipient address.

3. Submit proof of employment or promised placement from a local public school district.

The Education Chair will review all transcript(s) to determine if eligibility requirements are met. If all requirements are met, you will be notified of your acceptance into the program by the Education Chair.

- 4. Obtain Residency License (RL) form from your employer. Send RL form to Education Chair.
- 5. Complete FERPA form provided by Education Chair

# Plan of Study

The Elementary Education Residency Licensure Certificate is designed to be completed in two semesters. All courses, with the exception of EDU 283, are offered in 8-week sections in the fall semester as indicated on the Plan of Study.

Students have the option of following the Plan of Study as outlined or at a slower pace. The Residency License period is three years, students will have the three-year period to complete all course work, the required testing, and the required edTPA portfolio components.

#### Additional Course Details

- All courses are offered in 8-week sections except for EDU 283 which is a full 16-week course to allow for edTPA portfolio submission.
- EDU 270, EDU 272, EDU 277, EDU 278, and EDU 279 must be completed and passed before entering EDU 283.
- In addition, a grade of "C" or better must be earned in all courses.
- A GPA of 2.7 or higher is required to enroll in EDU 283
- If a course isn't completed successfully, it must be retaken in a semester prior to EDU
   283
- Prior to taking EDU 283, students are required to pass the required tests for licensure:
  - o Pearson Test 190: Foundations of Reading and
  - o Pearson Test 203: Mathematics Subtest or Praxis Test 7813: CKT Math Subtest

#### **Course Registration**

Permission is required to register for courses. Before permission is granted, official transcripts and the signed FERPA form must be provided. The Education Chair will verify that both are in place and will provide student with their Student ID number and grant permission to register. After receiving the student ID number, students will activate their Durham Tech account here <a href="http://selfservice.durhamtech.edu/">http://selfservice.durhamtech.edu/</a> and will be able to register for courses.

# **Program Expectations and Requirements**

# Attendance and Participation

Regular and active attendance is required in all courses. Students will demonstrate attendance with the completion of weekly assignments submitted in Canvas.

#### **Observation Requirements**

The EPP framework requires at least two observations per semester of each student candidate. Observations are completed by the course Instructor and are designed to provide in-person coaching and mentoring. In addition to the observations, course instructor(s) may offer virtual meetings and additional supports as needed either in person or virtually.

# Criteria for Program Completion and Licensure Recommendation

Student candidates are assessed throughout their time in the program using multiple measures to ascertain their skills, competencies, and dispositions.

To successfully complete the Residency Certificate program, a candidate must meet the following requirements.

- 1. Complete all coursework with a grade of 'C' or better.
- 2. Pass the following tests:
  - a. Pearson Test 190: Foundations of Reading and
  - b. Pearson Test 203: Mathematics Subtest or
  - c. Praxis Test 7813: CKT Math Subtest
- 3. Successfully complete edTPA requirements

- 4. Set up a DPI NC account and apply to NCDPI Online Licensure System

#### **EdTPA Information**

All candidates seeking initial licensure are expected to successfully complete and submit the 12 edTPA portfolio assessment during EDU 283. All teachers will be expected to meet the minimum score, as established by NCDPI.

edTPA is a performance-based, subject-specific assessment and support system used by teacher preparation programs throughout the United States to emphasize, measure and support the skills and knowledge that all teachers need from Day 1 in the classroom.

# **Complaint Process**

Pursuant to North Carolina General Statue 115C-269.55, the North Carolina State Board of Education (SBE) has the authority to receive reports of allegations of noncompliance regarding specific laws and rules associated with Educator Preparation Program (EPP) requirements. The SBE does not have the authority to receive complaints related to contractual arrangements with an EPP, commercial issues, obtaining a higher grade or credit for training, or seeking reinstatement to an EPP. The complaint process allows students to report allegations of

noncompliance with Article 17D of Chapter 115C of the General Statutes.
