

Novo Nordisk and Durham Technical Community College's Impact on the Triangle Region's Biotech Future

- <u>Novo Nordisk</u> is donating \$6 million to support <u>Durham Technical Community College's</u> new Life Science Training Center over four years, beginning with \$1.5 million in January 2023. This is the largest corporate donation in Durham Tech's history.
- The donation will support the **new Life Sciences Training Center and Durham Tech in the following key areas**:
 - Establishment of a Biotechnology Associate of Applied Science degree program (for current **college students**).
 - Purchase of **biotechnology training equipment**.
 - Creation of **onsite training for biotechnology career transition programs** to upskill/reskill existing employees and other related **workforce training** partnerships.
 - Outreach, awareness and course-taking for area **high school students** through the Career and College Promise Program.
 - Development of a diverse talent pipeline to assist residents of various backgrounds enter the rapidly expanding life science industry.
- Building on the recent passage of Durham Tech's \$112.7 million bond referendum, which included funding for the construction of the Life Sciences Training Center, the donation will help increase the <u>College</u>'s offerings in both short-term workforce credentials and degree program pathways for a growing life sciences sector.
- This first-of-its-size donation also includes:
 - A part-time Novo Nordisk employee "professor in residence" rotation program.
 - Novo Nordisk apprenticeships, internships and scholarship programs.
 - **Middle school** STEM programming and parent-student Novo Nordisk marquee events.
- Construction on the building is expected to conclude in 2026, starting with a groundbreaking in spring 2023, where the official name of the new Life Sciences Training Center will be announced pending a vote by the Durham Tech board of trustees.
- Novo Nordisk is committed to ensuring that both individuals planning their future careers and those seeking a transition understand and have access to the promise of a career in life sciences. Over Novo Nordisk's 30-year history in the Triangle region, Novo

Nordisk partnered with another community college in Johnston County to support similar infrastructure projects that make biotech-related programming available to students and workforce.
