**The LPN to ADN transition track is designed to allow currently Licensed Practical Nurses (LPNs) to further their

education to earn an Associate Degree in Nursing (ADN). Graduates of the program are eligible to apply for the National Council Licensure Examination for the Registered Nurse (NCLEX-RN).

Upon successful completion of NUR 214, NUR 221 and NUR 223, the student will receive block credit for NUR 111, NUR 112, NUR 113, NUR 114, and NUR 211. Students who complete this program will graduate with 70 credit hours.
